

## Asian Cultural Council Awards \$1.17 Million in Cultural Exchange Grants



## 2017 Grant Recipients

The Asian Cultural Council (ACC) has awarded \$1.17 million in grants to 62 individuals and 7 cultural organizations in the U.S. and Asia.

Selected from over 700 applicants, the individual grantees and the organizational project participants are artists, scholars, and arts specialists pursuing study or research abroad. They hail from Cambodia, China, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Korea, Myanmar, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam, and the U.S. Thirty-nine grants are for Asia-to-U.S. travel; 25 are for U.S.-to-Asia travel; 3 are for intra-Asia travel; and 2 grants involve travel both within Asia and between Asia and the U.S.

Among the 2017 grant recipients are an American ethnomusicologist who will study the effects of violence on musical culture in Afghanistan; a Vietnamese artist who will research Vietnamese diasporic communities in Cambodia for a project examining migration, identity, and memory within the context of conflict between the two nations; a Taiwanese vocalist trained in Chinese opera who will explore jazz music in New York and New Orleans; a Japanese scholar who will observe how marginalized voices are represented in American

theater; and a library manager from the Philippines who will study best practices in curating material culture as a means of public history. Three scholarships were given to Asian artists pursuing graduate degrees in the U.S. In addition to funding, grantees will receive extensive programmatic support, such as individualized recommendations, personal introductions to relevant contacts in the destination country, and access to ACC's more than 3,000-member alumni network.

Of the individual grant recipients, 24 will participate in ACC's New York fellowship program. With full support from ACC – from visa sponsorship and housing to customized program design – these fellows will reside in New York for up to six months, pursuing independent research projects, engaging with artists and cultural leaders, and exploring the city in search of new creative inspiration.

"International travel can be a transformative experience, and when that experience finds expression in the arts and humanities, its effect multiplies," says Executive Director Miho Walsh. "ACC's investment in cultural exchange is an investment in greater international understanding, and ultimately in our shared future. We are privileged to nurture this vision through the talents and creativity of our grantees, and we are delighted to welcome a new group of artists and scholars into ACC's global community."

Claire Brandon Independent Curator (New York): A 6-week grant to conduct research in Hong Kong, India, and Pakistan for an exhibition on contemporary Pakistani art

<u>Douglas Brooks</u> Boatbuilder (Vergennes, VT): A 3-month grant to study traditional boatbuilding in Japan and research its antecedents within the Chinese boatbuilding tradition

**Sirikarn Bunjongtad** Independent Theater Artist (Bangkok): A 6-month fellowship to be an artist-in-residence in the University of Connecticut's Puppet Arts Program and at the Ballard Institute and Museum of Puppetry

<u>Savinee Buranasilapin</u> Architect (Bangkok): A 2-month grant to explore land art in the American West and New York to enhance her architectural studio practice in Thailand

**Kevin Julius Castelo** Independent Percussionist (Manila): A living stipend for the first year in a Master of Music program at Indiana University, majoring in percussion performance

Yu An Chen Vocalist, Lee Qing Zhao Theatre Company (Taipei): A 6-month fellowship to take vocal training courses in New York City and explore jazz music in New Orleans

**Yulin Chen** Associate Professor, Tsinghua University (Beijing): A 5-month fellowship to attend the Special Program for Urban and Regional Studies (SPURS) at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology

Abigail Child Independent Film & Media Artist (New York): A month-long residency at Reversible Destiny Lofts in Tokyo to meet with artists and critics and to conduct research for a new film

<u>Core of Culture</u> (Chicago): A grant to bring a master dance artist from Ladakh, India to Chicago to receive 6 weeks of training in dance archiving and preservation

Faye Johanna Cura Associate Manager/Curator, Filipinas Heritage Library (Makati City): A 6-month fellowship to observe how libraries, archives, and museums in the U.S. exhibit material culture, and to study curatorial practice as a means of public history

Ellen Fisher Independent Performance Artist (New York): A 1-month grant to explore the Kataragama festival in Southeastern Sri Lanka

<u>DJ Hatfield</u> Associate Professor, Berklee College of Music (Boston): A 3-month fellowship to undertake a collaborative ethnomusicology project with indigenous communities in Hualien County, Taiwan

<u>Utsa Hazarika</u> Independent Artist (Delhi): A 1-year scholarship for travel and living expenses during the first year of an M.F.A. program in the U.S.

<u>Ellie Irons</u> Independent Artist (Brooklyn) A 1-month grant to engage in plant-based research while in residence at Bamboo Curtain Studio in Taiwan

Kyoko Iwaki Associate Lecturer, Goldmiths College (London & Tokyo): A 6-month month fellowship to conduct research on how non-dominant voices are represented in theater in the U.S.

Winner Jumalon Independent Artist (Marikina City, Philippines): a 6-month fellowship to explore contemporary art practices and participate in a studio residency program in the U.S.

<u>Yusuke Kamata</u> Independent Artist (Yokohama): A 6-month fellowship to research Japanese-style architecture in the U.S. as a lens into culture, art, and politics
